# 2023-2024 Goals for Commission Year and Progression (As presented to the Committee on April 28, 2024)

• Continue to strengthen the relationship between the Wauwatosa Youth Commission and Executive Branch of Wauwatosa government (ex. Mayor, Alderperson and the Common Council, Mayor's Office and Staff). We would also like to partner with other City Commissions and Committees on projects in the upcoming year.

- Birthday mailings to all identified Wauwatosa youth during the month of their 18-birthday to congratulate them and remind students to register to vote and for boys, register for the Selective Service duty
- Supported local high schools with donations to the theatre programs by purchasing Ad Space in the Playbills to promote the Youth Commission and possible membership in it.
- Continue Community Service and Outreach opportunities for youth of Wauwatosa. Members
  continue to look for service opportunities and events to increase the visibility of the Youth
  Commission.
- Continue to recruit youth and adult members for the Wauwatosa Youth Commission. The Youth Commission plans to reignite the member drive through acts of community service, public health initiatives, and word of mouth this upcoming year. We will have a table at the High School Registration days in August, 2023. We will also have an information table at the Incoming Freshman and Course Information nights at the High Schools in January, 2024.
- Revived again this year, from years prior to COVID shut down, we offered the opportunity to community members to nominate a youth who put forth outstanding volunteer effort in serving the Wauwatosa community. We had 2 nominations in late May of 2023, both were applicants with outstanding community volunteer efforts, and plaques were given to them on an individual basis. One young lady went off to college in Kansas and the other one, living in town, we invited to our May, 2024 meeting to congratulate her in person. (Their applications were

submitted in time, however we didn't receive them until after our May, 2023 meeting had passed due to a technical error). Pre-COVID, we always had a small ceremony with refreshments for our recipients and as a farewell to those members going off to college or leaving our membership. We had this ceremony this year at our May 8th, 2024 meeting and honored the young lady from 2023 and the young man from this year as our Volunteer Award recipients.

- Joined the Friends of County Grounds and Parks in helping with their 2<sup>nd</sup> Annual Story Book Walk in the park by donating funds to buy metal sign boards and helping them mount and laminate pages from 3 books in conjunction with the All City Read book choices. The sign boards were then installed in the park with 2 pages from each book inserted in the sign board. Each book will be displayed for a month at a time in the sign boards and then we'll help switch out the pages to the next book, and then for a third book. We plan to help with this again in the 2024 2025 Youth Commission year.
- We purchased a brick for the Veteran's War Memorial being constructed in Hart Park and will be working with the members of the Veteran's War Memorial committee to help research Veterans from past wars for their various War Kiosks at the park. We will also be a part of the dedication ceremony when the project is complete.
- We are participating in the upcoming Community Fair on June 14, 2024 to promote the Youth Commission and to learn what community members feel teens in Wauwatosa would benefit from having that they don't currently have available to them now.

- Gave \$100 each to the Wauwatosa East and Wauwatosa West APPSE teams to be put towards their competition and travel expenses for the National competition. This was a donation to them and publicity for our Commission.
- We used info learned from the survey questions we had at the Community Fair to decide to try to hold a Band Concert or Battle of the Bands Event in the Spring of 2025. Much work was done to plan the event this year, however when the time came to line the bands up, we were not able to

- find enough bands that could by perform on the date we reserved the Rotary Stage at Hart Park, so the event didn't happen. However; the process and information we learned from planning the event, may be used this upcoming year to plan another type of event.
- An electronic survey was developed and sent out to public and private schools this past April for the Youth residents of Wauwatosa to give input on a more detailed survey asking for services or events they would like to see available to them in Wauwatosa. We have well over 70 survey responses, which will be reviewed at our May 14<sup>th</sup>, 2025 meeting to begin planning for next year.
- We gained 7 Youth Members and no Adult Members in 2024 2025. In addition, one Youth renewed their membership term.
