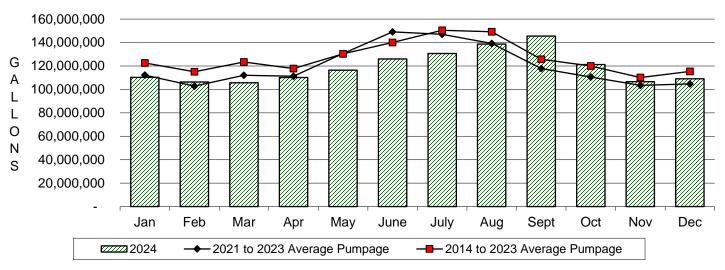

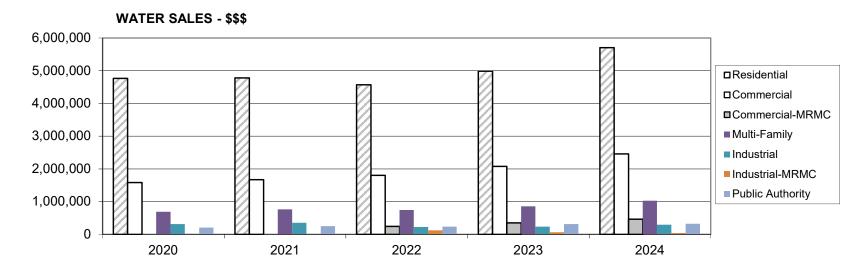

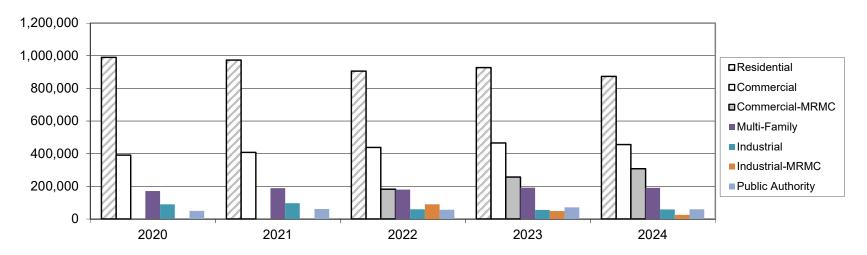

#### 2024 PLANNING ACTIVITIES

## 2024 highlights include:

- Continued work on the Comprehensive Plan rewrite. Plan adoption anticipated February 2025 with subsequent zoning change recommendations in mid-2025.
- Initiated public outreach about the allowance of accessory dwelling units.
- Continued to assist Communications staff with development updates and mapping information.
- Adopted new floodplain maps as required by FEMA.
- Continued to refine EnerGov ERP configurations.
- Coordinated Development Department Board of Public Works applications.
- Continued communication with the GIS Manager for planning-related GIS functionality.
- Members of the Planning Division staff attended the following conferences/training: Congress for New Urbanism, American Planning Association, and NACTO.
- Completed Schoonmaker Reef signage.
- The Historic Preservation Commission presented two Preservation of Properties Awards 1409 Wauwatosa Ave. (Troquet, exterior remodeling) and 1809 Wauwatosa Ave. (front porch reconstruction).

# Development Department – Economic Development Division 2024 Economic Development Activities

- With the Wauwatosa Revolving Loan Fund Corporation (WRLFC) and Community
  Development Authority (CDA), assisted six small businesses through their traditional financial
  assistance to facilitate redevelopment and business expansions (revolving loans and
  forgivable loans.)
- Created a new small business forgivable loan program to expand eligible projects and allow for greater flexibility when assisting new or expanding small businesses.
- Applied to WEDC for additional funds to support the CDA's forgivable loan programs to allow for expanded eligibility options and increased capacity.
- Continued to promote all of Wauwatosa, including specific identified priority areas.
- Continued to promote CDA and WRLFC loans through the web, other partners, and oneon-one meetings and joint marketing materials.
- Continued to improve online economic development assistance information.
- Continued implementing the Wauwatosa Housing Policy through the Economic Development Investment Policy and available financial resources.
- Continued TIF negotiations to facilitate redevelopment projects and received Common Council approval of term sheets.
- Continue to manage the approval of Mandel's Harlow & Hem proposal for the Blanchard Street Parking Lot.
- Closed on the sale of the property at 6330 W North Avenue for a local, small business redevelopment; Idyll Coffee is renovating the building and will open in 2025.
- Listed for redevelopment the property at 7746 Menomonee River Parkway and are in the process of soliciting and reviewing proposals.
- Initiated a new strategy for redevelopment of the former landfill parcel that includes evaluation and environmental investigation of potential uses and relocation of DPW yard waste operations.
- Repurposed unspent Small Business Building Improvement ARPA funds to support current small business forgivable loan programs and catalytic redevelopment projects.
