3. Lock Box Discussion - Dain Maddox

Dain reached out to Cody at the Fire Department for details about the program.

- 10 lock boxes were sold last year at \$50 per item
- They have to be purchased through WFD, not on their own, to ensure WFD can access them
- When people pay for the lock box those funds go back into the WFD to continue to support the program

WAUWATOSA HEALTH DEPARTMENT REPORTS

1. Senior Center/Senior Club

> They are back at Hart Park Senior Center as of Jan 25. Open House is this Wednesday 2/19 from 10-noon. Dining program back up and running on 2/24. Update on the Senior *Club site at City Hall - there are people who find that space convenient and prefer to* come there. Kosta and Mathew Vanderkamp met with DPW staff to discuss the future use of this space. There was no alternate plan for the space, so it remains available for the Senior Club. Will bring some things to HPSC such as Bingo, and they will no longer host lunches at the City Hall site since it is available at HPSC. Kosta shared there is a need for more disabled parking spots at HPSC - the current spots are still far away. Dain will follow up with Kosta to try look further into this. Kosta has even considered valet service. Health and Wellness Fair collaborative event with the Health Department may resume next year. Third party taking over event planning so need to look more into it. 514 current members.

3. Health Department and Age-Friendly Tosa

Senior Planet courses planned out through the end of March, in the Firefly Room, 10:30-noon; Tech Time on Fridays 10-1 (Library) and new this year, on Wednesdays 10- noon and 2-3:30pm at Hart Park Senior Center; Refurbished laptop project starting up in April using grant funds. Narcan Training will be held on 3/25 from 6-7pm in the Firefly Room. Kristen organized a Period Pantry drive to collect menstrual products for individuals in need. 30 volunteers came to help pack 750 kits, the community was very generous in donating products and their time.
