REPORT OF THE POLICE CHIEF

James MacGillis, Police Chief, presented.

Operational Updates

1. Crime trends

Year to date comparison 2024 & 2025

- Motor Vehicle theft down 40%
- Burglaries up 35% largely due to key fob steals in large multi-dwelling housing
- Retail theft up 15%

2. Suburban Major Incident Response Team

Officers and Supervisors deployed to support UW-M with encampment remembrance events as part of SMIRT. UW-MPD lead the operation which was uneventful.

3. Harm Reduction Team Collaboration

The Harm Team working with Traffic Engineering and using similar data collection to support vision zero county initiative to impact traffic safety.

Support Services

1. Staffing update

Recent and upcoming retirements, contract status- passed unanimously yesterday, discussion about waiver for Wong's vacancy; Academy graduation. 3 new officers - which is really two due to deployment.

2. Department training

Recent in-service topics. In Service training, this included a one-day Supervisor course, where team building and personality style management was covered. All sworn personnel attended a two-day training, hosted by WCTC. That training consisted of State-mandated EVOC, room clearing and a review of the Officer Involved Shooting/Death policy.
