Good Morning Michael,

My family and I live at the home at 6745 W Wisconsin Ave. We are one of the homes most affected by the addition of the turn lane and removal of street parking. I am in favor of the proposed parking prohibition. Since the project was completed many cars have parked in that area creating a hazardous condition.

During the city wide property re-assessments these changes were not taken into account. Loosing street parking for the residents of these homes needs to be addressed on property value.

As for my home being right on the corner, my family now has traffic going by our home roughly 10' closer to the property with the addition of the turn lane. This creates a safety issue for my children with most cars driving past my driveway at nearly 40 mph. The driveway access to the home has also been affected with having to back out across a thru lane and a turn lane. The intersection directly next to the home is now very brightly lit and has crosswalk buttons that beep. Both of those changes cause significant light and noise pollution to the home.

While I realize infrastructure improvements were needed to address traffic concerns, I am asking that the city assessors office does the right thing and take into account those changes on all the properties affected. These changes we will all have to learn to live with on my street, but I am asking for a fair amount to be taken off the assessed value of the homes as these changes will be permanent.
